CAPITAL Credits



One of the Cooperative Differences

When you receive electric service from New-Mac Electric Cooperative, you're more than a customer. You're a member and an owner of your electric cooperative. Because New-Mac is a not-for-profit electric cooperative, any revenue collected beyond what is needed to operate the cooperative is allocated back to members in the form of patronage capital.

How does it work?

Each year, New-Mac tracks the amount of electricity you purchase. If revenues exceed the cooperative's operating expenses, your portion of those margins is allocated to you based on your electric use during that year. Those funds aren't immediately returned. Capital credits are used for important cooperative needs such as maintaining and improving our electric system, replacing equipment and investing in reliability. This helps reduce the amount of money the cooperative needs to borrow.

Each year, when the cooperative's financial condition allows, the Board of Directors may approve the retirement of a certain year's capital credits. That means money is returned to members who received an allocation for the years being retired.

Keep Your Information Current

Capital credits belong to you, even if you move away from New-Mac's service area. That's why it's important to keep your mailing address current with us.

Moved recently? Contact New-Mac Electric to update your address so we can find you when capital credits are retired.

It's one more way the cooperative model is different. You're not just buying electricity. You have a stake in the cooperative that serves you.

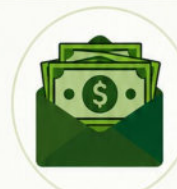
